How to Make a Pumpkin into a Book Character

- Start with a pumpkin. The foam pumpkins that are available at craft stores are very much preferred as real pumpkins quickly rot. *DO NOT CARVE INTO A REAL PUMPKIN.
- Use the "pumpkin project blueprint" to sketch out ideas and make a list of supplies that you will need.
- Gather your supplies and have fun being creative. You are welcome to do this on your own or have fun completing it as a family project.
- There are no specific guidelines regarding the materials you use. Below is a list of supplies that others have used. You may find it useful for generating ideas.

paint	construction paper	markers
wiggly eyes	pipe cleaners	pom poms
Felt	fabric	cotton balls
yarn	buttons	stickers
feathers	fur	props: glasses,
glue/hot glue	glitter	jewelry, crowns, etc.
